- A K-8 school serving students of all faiths and economic backgrounds
- Rigorous academic curriculum focusing on technology and the core subjects of language arts, mathematics, science and social studies
- Student teacher ratio of 15:1
- Longer academic day (8 a.m. to 4 p.m.) and a longer academic year (185 days)
- Learning specialists and tutors to provide one-to-one and small group assistance
- Free early morning child care and breakfast beginning at 7 a.m.
- After School Academic Program that offers homework assistance and tutoring and provides a safe place for students during a parent's work day
- Regular standardized testing and goal-setting to improve student performance
- Instruction in Spanish, finance, physical education and music
- High school admissions and scholarship assistance tailored to each individual student
- A range of extracurricular activities – from athletics to violin – to support the whole child
- An endowment to provide eligible families with tuition assistance.

A TYPICAL DAY IN KINDERGARTEN

Kindergarten at Mission Dolores Academy is a full-day program. Students spend at least 12 hours each week studying the core subjects of reading, writing and math. Kindergarten employs a full-time credentialed teacher and an assistant.

Besides learning the basics of reading, writing and math, our kindergarten students participate in a full range of enrichment activities: technology instruction, music, visual arts, drama and physical education.

TUITION AND FEES

For the 2011-2012 school year, the tuition for one child is \$5,000. If a family has two children in the school, the tuition will be \$7,500. If a family has three or more children in the school, the tuition will be \$9,000.

A generous financial assistance program has been established. These funds will be awarded to qualifying families based on financial need.
